Course: How to Teach Poetry	Lecture 4: Democratize the Classroom (4 of 15)
TEACHER GOALS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Who runs the classroom? Who runs the world? ● Use PowerPoetry's model for a student-lead, democratized poetry class ● Encourage student participation in the classroom ● Create a safe classroom space for students to participate and express themselves ● Teach students to apply leadership and poetry-writing skills to real-world situations
STUDENT GOALS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Learn how to direct a class ● Encourage peers to participate ● Gain tools for social engagement/interacting with authority figures ● Use writing skills to make real-world changes
TEACHER DO NOW	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Have students break off into groups of 3
STUDENT DO NOW	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● In groups students will read PowerPoetry's 6 Tips for Using Poetry in a Speech (http://www.powerpoetry.org/actions/6-tips-using-poetry-speech) ● Students will choose a topic from http://www.powerpoetry.org/action to write an argumentative piece/mock speech about
MINI-LESSON/ACTIVITY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students will use PowerPoetry's



	<p>Speech Tip Guide to write a mock speech arguing for a change having to do with an area of interest from PowerPoetry's Action Guides</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● The first $\frac{3}{4}$ of class will be devoted to constructing the speech● The last $\frac{1}{4}$ of class is reserved for students to present their speech to the class
